Arizona-Based Non-Profit Assists Underserved Rural Areas through National Grant

Bob Woodruff Foundation Provides COVID-19 Relief Funding to Help Arizona Veterans, Families

Phoenix, Ariz. (Feb. 4, 2021) – The [Arizona Coalition for Military Families](#), a non-profit providing resources, support and advocacy for Arizona’s service members, veterans and their families, is proud to announce that it has received multiple grants from the Bob Woodruff Foundation, including an [NFL-Bob Woodruff Foundation](#) (BWF) partnership grant as part of the “Healthy Lifestyles and Creating Community” program, to support the Be Connected program to address urgent needs related to COVID-19. The award is part of an investment of \$1.6 million to best-in-class organizations that are providing programs and services to veterans, caregivers, and military families impacted by COVID-19 across the country.

The funding is providing support, resources and solutions to Arizona’s service members, veterans, their families and caregivers with an upstream, early intervention approach to suicide prevention that reduces stress at home, especially with the specific needs of the veteran community related to the impact of the pandemic.

“The immediate and long-term impacts of COVID-19 on our veterans and their families is wide-ranging—including mental health challenges, economic concerns and the anxiety that comes from financial uncertainty,” said Thomas Winkel, veteran and founder of the Arizona Coalition for Military Families. “With this generous support from the Bob Woodruff Foundation, we are able to offer additional support for the most pressing needs for our Arizona families during COVID-19, including housing, employment, transportation, access to basic needs like water and firewood and financial support.”

Headquartered in Phoenix, the Arizona Coalition for Military Families operates the [Be Connected](#) support line, 866-4AZ-VETS, that offers no cost concierge-style assistance with a navigation team located all across the state who specialize in understanding the needs of Arizona’s diverse military and veteran population. From navigating the VA healthcare system to finding housing and helping veterans and their family members advance their careers, the Be Connected program is grateful for the generous support from this grant to further expand its service offerings concentrated in northern Arizona to include the following:

- **Be Connected Transportation:** *No cost transportation services to deliver essentials (food, prescriptions, etc.). This program operates with volunteer drivers and will expand to transporting veterans to appointments and stores once safe to do so with COVID-19.*
- **Clean Water to the Hopi and Navajo Nations:** *Partnering to deliver 300-gallon water containers to homes with no access to running water on the Hopi and Navajo Nations, resulting in more consistent access to clean water for drinking and hygiene.*
- **Direct Assistance:** *Delivering direct financial assistance to veteran households in rural communities in northern Arizona including mortgage and rent assistance, car repairs, utility assistance, firewood, supplies and more.*
- **Food Security:** *Addressing food insecurity in the veteran community through assistance and support to identify additional resources for on-going needs.*
